Eco-Cycle: Center for Hard to Recycle Materials (CHaRM)

CHaRM opened in 2001 and was the first facility of its kind in the nation. It collects unusual materials like electronics, Styrofoam, appliances, yoga mats, fire extinguishers, bicycles and parts, porcelain toilets, plastic bags, and more for recycling and reuse.

Boulder County Recycling Center

By taking a tour of the Boulder County Recycling Center (BCRC) people of all ages can expand their knowledge on recycling and its importance, witness the current and ongoing processes involved in recycling operations, and help to further educate our community by spreading learned knowledge. The BCRC is a public drop-off center that prepares recyclable materials for shipment to recycling mills. The facility processes over 45,000 tons a year and has the capacity to process 75,000 tons a year. The facility accepts and processes single-stream recyclable materials.

Boulder County Hazardous Materials Management Facility

The Boulder County Hazardous Materials Management Facility (HMMF) accepts household hazardous wastes from residents of Boulder County and Broomfield County and the Town of Erie every Wednesday-Saturday. We also accept VSQG waste on Tuesdays by appointment only. In 2018, the HMMF accepted over a million pounds of HHW materials from 19,146 residents and 336 VSQG businesses.
