JUNE 1-9, 2021

8 HR HAZWOPER REFRESHER PART I & 2

This is the annual HAZWOPER refresher training required for HHW facility staff and is specifically targeted for Household Hazardous Waste operations and taught by professional HHW personnel. The class is offered for two days with a four-hour session every day.

Even though latex paint is one of the most common household hazardous wastes, some of the regulatory issues for disposal are surprisingly complicated. This presentation will review what is (and isn't) latex paint and will cover everything you need to know to safely dispose of latex paint and comply with all applicable regulations, including:

- What is latex paint, compared to other types of paints and coatings
- Safe storage of latex paint
- Hazardous waste rules that apply to the disposal of latex paint
- The household hazardous waste exemption and latex paint
- Re-use and recycling of latex paint
- Bills of lading, hazardous waste manifests and other required documentation

HHW FOR MANAGERS

Household Hazardous Waste managers are responsible for compliance of their facilities with many regulatory requirements from many different local and state agencies. This course is designed for those HHW program supervisors that oversee operations but do not actively work in the facility handling wastes.

ADVANCED HHW OPERATIONS AND PERMITTING

This class is an opportunity for seasoned HHW personnel, who already have more than a basic knowledge of HHW management, to consider and discuss the application of laws, regulations, and guidance documents to a variety of complex scenarios. This class will also review the various permits, approvals operations plan, what activities are allowed at different types of collection methods (door-to-door, temp events, permanent).

Attendees will be presented with regulatory issues to decipher into realistic procedures.

DOT HM TRANSPORTATION REFRESHER PACKING WASTE PART I & 2

This course provides the required refresher for workers who package hazardous waste and these individuals signing manifests, bills of lading, and other shipping documents for hazardous and universal wastes. An update of numerous new shipping requirements will also be presented including the new Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest requirements, security plans, packaging standards, shipping names, and hazardous waste of concern requirements.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE FOR HHW PERSONNEL/NATURAL DISASTER/THINGS THAT GO BOOM

The Emergency Response for HHW Programs focuses on the applicable emergency response requirements for HHW programs and offers practical advice to plan for and address emergencies both at the facility and in the community. The training will include how to determine an emergency situation, response measures, agency notifications, and documentation.
